

## NORA'S STORY

In November 2024, Nora began what her family initially believed was a stubborn virus — a high fever that left her barely eating, drinking, or moving. After three days, her fever broke, but instead of improving, she became even more lethargic, prompting a visit to Children's Hospital North. What doctors found there was far more serious than a virus: Nora had a rash and dangerously low blood pressure, and she was immediately transported by ambulance to the ICU at the main campus in Denver.

A month shy of her fifth birthday, Nora was unable to walk, talk, or even open her eyes. After extensive testing and careful evaluation, physicians diagnosed her with Kawasaki Disease and began IVIG treatment on day seven of her illness. The first infusion produced little response, but a second treatment on day eight led to dramatic improvement. Though she lost significant weight and spent several days in the ICU before transitioning to a regular hospital room, Nora gradually regained her strength with the support of an exceptional care team. Thanks to the swift diagnosis by the Kawasaki Disease clinic, she avoided any damage to her heart or other organs. Today, she is incredibly fortunate to be fully healthy once again.

## DANTE'S STORY

On the morning of Dante's second birthday, what should have been a joyful celebration quickly turned into every parent's worst fear. He woke up with swollen lymph nodes, extreme fatigue, and a fever that wouldn't break. As the day went on, his condition worsened—he became quiet and withdrawn, developing a rash, facial swelling, red hands, peeling lips, and persistent high fevers. After days of uncertainty and hospital visits, and just moments before being sent home without answers, a pediatric ER doctor recognized the signs of Kawasaki disease.

Dante was admitted immediately and began IVIG treatment that same night. He spent five long days in the hospital fighting bravely while his family watched helplessly and prayed for answers. We were ultimately blessed with the best possible outcome—no lasting heart damage and a full recovery.

Now nearly four years old, Dante is healthy, thriving, and full of life. In gratitude, he has chosen to use his birthdays to raise awareness for Kawasaki disease instead of receiving gifts. He is our little Kawasaki warrior, and our family remains committed to advocating for awareness, early diagnosis, and hope for children and families facing this disease.
